Summer Bridge NSBE Jr. Scholarship grants help cover the cost of these very important summer bridge programs.

To be eligible for a Summer Bridge NSBE Jr. Scholarship, students must be enrolled in a STEM-focused summer enrichment program run by a college or university for the summer of 2014. The exact amount of the grant will vary, depending on the cost of the program.
